Currently former civil servants, military officers and politicians have to consult with an independent body - ACOBA - before they take jobs in the private sector after leaving or retiring from public service. This body can advise they do not take a job because of potential conflicts or interest, or suggest restrictions, such as barring them from lobbying government and officials that worked for them. Currently ACOBA is only advisory, and doesn't have any legal powers to enforce its recommendations.
